**Remember:** A hyphen goes between two words before a noun to act as a single idea.

**Example:** A dog-friendly hotel is one that allows dogs to stay, but a dog friendly hotel is likely shaped like a friendly dog. See the difference?

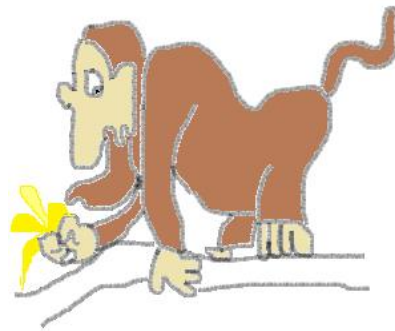

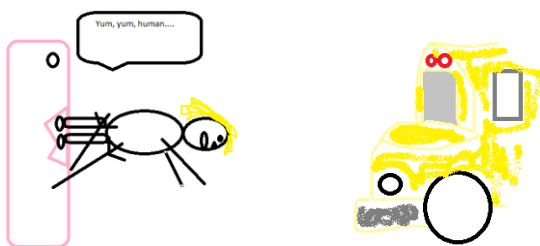
