

## Relative Clauses

### Worksheet 2

A relative clause is a dependent clause that has a subject and a verb but cannot stand alone. Typically, the connecting words used are who, whom, whose, that, and which.

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2. She lives in Arizona. She likes living in Arizona.

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3. I love the new restaurant. The new restaurant is right next door.

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6. A man phoned my home. That man is my brother.

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7. The camera was expensive. The camera is on the table.
